2. ACTIVITIES PERFORMED BY SVS IN THE PERIOD OF LAST YEAR

The Zveza SVS member clubs and their members are very active the whole year around preparing various events, meetings, seminars, excursions, exhibitions and fairs. Therefore the club members have many different opportunities to participate, to fulfill their hobby needs and expectations and to socialize with other members and classic vehicles enthusiasts. The most important activities and events in the period 2010 – 2011 are listed below:

2.1 Events Calendar

Regular 2011 Events Calendar was prepared and published in October 2010. The SVS member clubs planed to organize 56 rallies and meetings from Februar until October 2011 all around Slovenia. These events normally have about 80 – 120 participants from SVS and Svamz member clubs and also a lot of non-club member participants. Usually these are one day events. Some events have international participants (Kamnik, Koper, Škofljica, Murska Sobota, Maribor...). Many SVS members participate to various events in Austria, Italy and Croatia (Karawankenklassik, Trieste-Opicina, ...).

There are also two 3 – 5 day events (Slovenia Classic Marathon, Slovenia Classic Rally) passing this year through Italy and Croatia.

2.2 SVS Championship

The SVS Championship organized this year has six regularities with time keeping and driving skills tests. About 800 SVS club members and non club members normally participate to the Championship events (the championship results are valid only for SVS members).

2.3 Vehicle ID Cards and Vehicle Status reports

Zveza SVS has issued 547 SVS ID Cards in 2011 and 752 SVS ID Cards in 2010 as well as 8 FIVA ID Cards in 2011 and 3 FIVA ID Cards in 2010. In this year 3 of these FIVA ID Cards were issued to Svamz members on their own initiative and request.

In total from 1997 until mid 2011 already 7.800 SVS ID Cards and 31 FIVA ID Cards have been issued (issuing FIVA ID Cards started in 2003). The procedure for ID Cards issuing is described on the web page and opened to all candidates whose vehicles comply to the regulation. FIVA ID Cards are issued by SVS - FIVA ANF, to all candidates regardless their club or federation membership.

Additional invitation to apply for FIVA ID Card was published on web page and sent by e-mail to all slovene clubs in February 2011, regardless their federation membership. The invitation was also sent to Svamz member clubs, because Svamz is continuing to refuse to apply for FIVA ID Cards for their members and is ignoring and boycotting SVS as FIVA ANF.

The Historic vehicle status reports are issued for the vehicles that comply to the regulations before they can be recognized as historic vehicles by the authorities and be registered and input into the official historic vehicle registry held by the authorities. This service, performed by SVS, is opened to all candidates regardless their club or federation membership. In the period of the last year about 1450 Vehicle Status reports were issued to members and to non-members.

2.4 FIVA General Assembly 2010

FIVA General Assembly 2010 was organized by Zveza SVS and held in Ljubljana in October 2010. About 120 representatives and their partners participated to the commission meetings, to the assembly meeting and to the additional programme events.

2.5 SVS Publishing activities

Four numbers of SVS Magazine from total 8 have been issued in the period of the past year. The SVS Magazine was distributed to about 3.500 addresses of SVS members. About 300

SVS has issued a book Made in Birmingham 1 - Fragments from British Industrial Giant BSA, 1689 – 1973, written by Svamz member Mr. Matija Šalehar. 500 copies were printed.

SVS has also sponsored the book on Jaguar XK 140 restoration project written by SVS member Mr. Jože Kogoj, issued in 300 copies.

2.6 Cooperation with the authorities

The Ministry of transportation of Slovenia has established a work group for road traffic security, lead by Mr. Zajec, Ministry secretary, where the representatives of SVS are invited and participate in the activities.

Regular meetings with representatives of Public Agency for Road Traffic Security of Slovenia are held. At those meetings the activity and issues of issuing of Historic Vehicle Status Reports are discussed, because Zveza SVS is authorized to issue the Reports which are necessary for vehicle owners in the process of vehicle registration.

2.7 Cooperation with FIVA

Zveza SVS has been accepted to FIVA membership in 2000 and became FIVA ANF upon regular procedure. Since then SVS follows the FIVA regulations and statutes, regularly pays the membership fees, participates to FIVA activities and FIVA General Assemblies, spreads the FIVA spirit and idea among historic vehicle enthusiasts all around Slovenia and helps with advice and experience the colleagues in Croatia, Serbia and Bosnia.

2.8 Cooperation agreements with AMZS and Motul

Recently SVS concluded an agreement on cooperation with AMZS – Automobile Association of Slovenia, which has about 120.000 members. The agreement recognizes the authority of Zveza SVS in classic vehicles activities. AMZS will support in public and with the authorities the SVS classic vehicle activities.

An agreement on cooperation and partnership has been signed with Motul Slovenia. As a result the SVS members have acquired some benefits in motor oil and lubricants prices.

2.9 Cooperation with other similar organizations

Zveza SVS, as civil law organization, and 12 individual SVS members are also members of Conservators - Restores Association of Slovenia.

The SVS members participate every year to different work shops on traffic and vehicles history organized by Technical Museum of Slovenia.

2.10 Exhibitions and fairs

In September 2010 SVS organized the 4th International Classic Vehicle Festival in Ljubljana together with Gospodarsko razstavišče Ljubljana (Ljubljana Exhibition and Convention Center). SVS member clubs successfully presented about 600 vehicles on 4.500 m² in three halls.

In April 2011 SVS member clubs participated to the Trade Fair at Gornja Radgona with about 120 vehicles on 1000 m² in one hall.

Some of SVS clubs (Škofljica, Ljutomer, Rogašovci, Murska Sobota, Slovenska Bistrica, Codelli) organize regular new and used spare parts trade fairs.

2.11 Excursions and visits

The SVS member clubs organize, as usually every year, one day or more day visits to most known historic vehicles exhibitions and spare parts fairs like: Padua, Imola, Essen, Paris, Stuttgart, Ulm, Thuln, Caorle, Beaulieu. The visits are organized by bus or by plane. Approximately 1.000 members participated to these excursions.

2.12 Seminars

In February 2011 the regular yearly vehicle scroottiners seminar was organized for 60 participants from SVS clubs. The scroottineering procedures and skills were up-dated before on-coming season at the seminar. The scroottineers are authorized to prepare the Historic Vehicle Status Reports, SVS ID Cards and some of them also FIVA ID Cards, which are than centrally issued by the SVS Technical Commission. An interestig lecture on motor oils was presented by the representative of Motul Slovenia

A similar seminar for 40 events Marshalls was organized in March 2011. The aim was to review the event regulations and to unify the time and driving skills measurement standards.

SVS started organizing such seminars for its own scroottineers and marshals already in 2002.

2.13 Club representatives meetings

Regular club representatives and General Commettee members meetings are organized on monthly basis, if necessaty also more often. The common issues are discussed and the club life is presented. See: <http://www.zveza-svs.si/obvestila/256-urnik-sestankov-zveze-svs.html>
